The course is in three parts:

PHILOSOPHY OF RELIGION

Philosophical Issues, The Nature and Influence of Religious Experience, Problems of Evil and Suffering, Religious Language, Life after Death and Works of Scholars.

THE STUDY OF ETHICS

Significant Debates across environmental and equality issues, a Study of Ethical Theories such as utilitarianism - the greater good; situation ethics; natural moral law, Application of Ethical Theories regarding war and peace and sexual ethics, Medical Ethics with a focus on beginning and end of life issues.

THEOLOGY – NEW TESTAMENT STUDIES

Social, Historical and Religious context of the New Testament, Interpretation of Jesus, Text, Scripture.
