We run a number of trips and visits to various historical sites. One of these is the Battlefields visit to the either the First World War battlefields of Ypres and the Somme, or to the Second World War battlefields of the Normandy landing beaches. We also have links with the Holocaust Educational Trust and have sent students on their Lessons from Auschwitz programme, which involves meetings with Holocaust survivors and visits to the concentration camp itself.
